MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING, JUNE 4, 2018

1. CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM by Chairperson Angell. Present were Committee members Botta, Cardwell, Gomez, Melero, Valentini and Wais.
2. AGENDA ORDER: No requests for items out of order.
3. PUBLIC COMMENTS ON NON-AGENDA ITEMS: The Lions Club is having their annual Pasta Dinner on June 9.
- 4.a. REPORT FROM DEPUTY SPANGLER: Deputy Spangler reported that the RV is now gone from Alhambra Street. The homeless woman known as Agent Dora has moved on. She continues to refuse assistance. Deputy Balea is still working on eviction of people near Nantucket. She said there are still a few people remaining in that area. She is hoping for cooperation from the landowner.
- 4.b. REPORT FROM CHP ON TRAFFIC ISSUES: Officer Joyner reported on school enforcement day: 22 tickets were issued, 13 for speed and 9 for other issues. He reported after the agreement from the committee that the radar warning trailer would come back to Crockett to remind drivers of their speed in posted areas.
- 4.c. NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH: No report.
- 4.d. TRUCK AND TRAFFIC UPDATES: No report.
- 4.e. PUBLIC DISCUSSION: Reminder to call the Sheriff's non-emergency number for vehicles parked without moving in excess of 72 hours. There is no law on open doors/windows for loud music coming from our bars. Bars will be reminded of late night, loud music.
- 5.a. PUBLIC SURVEY QUESTIONS: Lengthy discussion was held on downtown parking issues. Suggestions were made on type of questions, who should be asked, defining the area affected, among other suggestions. A list of sample questions was given to the General Manager from a member of the public. A questionnaire will be developed to canvas residents regarding their opinions/concerns and be brought back to the Committee for consideration.
- 5.b. PROPOSED FY 18/19 BUDGET: Proposed budget was received and accepted as presented.
6. REPORTS FROM COMMITTEE MEMBERS: Chairperson Angell reminded everyone that the graduation ceremonies will be held this week. Carquinez Middle School will be held this Thursday followed by John Swett High graduation on Friday. Traffic will be busy around the schools these evenings.
