The Crockett Community Services District (Crockett CSD) is your local government providing municipal services to Crockett and Port Costa. We are eager to foster informed civic engagement. We answer to you, the voters of Crockett and Port Costa, and we are working to become more visible and better understood through publications such as this. We are also working to upgrade our website with an emphasis on building a growing community of better informed residents. We are investigating the expansion of our presence on social media platforms as well in an effort to foster conversation with our voters and other people and businesses that we serve.

Crockett CSD has a Board of five Directors who oversee the work of three Commissions and other Committees of dedicated volunteers. Newly elected Board Members Emma Sutton and Michael Kirker were seated on December 19. Kent Peterson was elected president of the Board, and we now begin another year of service to Crockett and Port Costa. 2018 was a very successful year for Crockett CSD, and we intend that 2019 will be even better.

Each year brings new requirements that are imposed by regulatory agencies and may cause significant cost burdens. They may come from the Regional Water Quality Control Board or the Bay Area Air Quality Management District. They may come from County agencies such as the health department, a local agency such as the fire dept, or from other agencies such as the State Controller. Whatever comes our way this year, we are confident that our capable staff, supported by our engineering consultants, legal consultant and auditor, will handle every challenge skillfully.

The District Board is also supported by the many volunteers who act as the Recreation Commission, the Port Costa Sanitary Commission, the Crockett Sanitary Commission, the Crockett Police Liaison Committee, or the Memorial Hall Advisory Committee. Openings on all of these bodies occur from time to time, at which point we advertise for applicants. If you are interested in community service, please make your interests known to our General Manager, Dale McDonald. We expect to advertise separately for a new recreation commissioner and a new member of the Police Liaison Committee in January, as Elena Gomez has announced her retirement from both entities. We gratefully thank Elena for outstanding work during her twenty years of community service!

Armistice Celebration

People gathered on November 11 at Crockett's World War I Memorial Hall to celebrate the 100 year anniversary of the end of 'The Great War' in Europe in 1918. Our Memorial Hall Advisory Committee, led by Ron Wilson, put on a memorable and well-attended event, assisted by volunteers from the Crockett Museum. There were Scottish bagpipes and bugler, the raising of flags, and poetry reading. The John Swett Band played the National Anthem. Two generals and other men in uniform took part in the celebration.

Scott Lawton acted as master of ceremonies, ringing a large bell at just the moment when guns fell silent 100 years earlier, while the public joined in ringing small bells for peace. Major General Dan Helix of Rodeo spoke about World War I, which had been called a century ago 'the war to end all war.' Brigadier General Dennis Edmonson laid a wreath in remembrance of those who sacrificed. Kathy Cargo read the poem "And There Was A Great Calm." And Kent Peterson reviewed our efforts to date to restore Memorial Hall for return to community service.

The entire event was poignant and heart-felt, remembering a tragic event in world history and the twelve men of Crockett/Port Costa who gave their lives for their country. Crockett CSD, owner of Memorial Hall, is proud to be taking the lead role in restoring this unique asset. Great appreciation is due the volunteers of the Memorial Hall Advisory Committee: Ron Wilson, Kent Peterson, Scott Lawton, Bud Burlison, Charles Dell, Michael Kirker and Harvey Duran. Although their work is largely unseen, they have been doing a great job!
