The Crockett Community Services District (Crockett CSD) is your local government providing municipal services to Crockett and Port Costa. We are eager to foster informed civic engagement. We answer to you, the voters of Crockett and Port Costa, and we are working to become more visible and better understood through publications such as this. We are also working to upgrade our website with an emphasis on building a growing community of better informed users. We intend to expand our presence on social media platforms as well in an effort to foster conversation with our voters and other people and businesses that we serve.

Crockett CSD has an elected Board of five Directors who oversee the work of three Commissions and other Committees of dedicated volunteers. The next election to the Board of Directors will occur this November, at which time three seats will be open to civic-minded individuals for four year terms. Other exciting opportunities to serve are available right now, however. We have been advertising an open seat on our Recreation Commission and an open seat on our Crockett Sanitary Commission. These openings are posted at our Crockett Community Center. Contact our General Manager Dale McDonald to apply. No experience is required, just a serious interest in being involved in civic functions.

The Crockett Recreation Commission oversees the provision of recreation services to Crockett and Port Costa through the hard work of our Recreation Department staff lead by Ron Wilson. We have an outstanding complex of public recreation facilities that are expertly managed and maintained. Our historic Crockett Community Center provides spaces for everything from town meetings and wedding receptions to small meetings and classes. A nutrition program serves lunches there to seniors of all ages each weekday, while the large commercial kitchen allows caterers to ably provide for larger crowds. The May 19 *Walk of Honor for Our Veterans* will start and end here for a great day of celebration, food, and a giant raffle.

Our swimming pool serves the John Swett Swim Team and the Crockett Swim Team for training and swim meets as well as summer swim classes and public swimming. Memorial Day marks the start of public swimming, open every day until late August. Adult lap swimming and aqua zumba classes are also offered. In this issue we showcase the

CROCKETT IMPROVEMENT ASSOCIATION (CIA), a local non-profit that has been an important part of the community since the 1960's. It was born out of unhappiness with the decline that Crockett was then suffering. There were concerns about such new trends as drug use, absentee landlords of distressed properties, and growing vandalism of public areas in town. Reversing these trends was essential, but Crockett had always depended on C&H and did not have the civic institutions and abilities necessary to succeed. During the 1960's, C&H was actually working to disengage itself from its corporate benevolence of the past. Into this breech stepped an assortment of locals who just could not tolerate the situation any longer. They coalesced informally as the Crockett Improvement and Businessmen's Association, then incorporating as the Crockett Improvement Association in 1971.

The CIA has always been a strong advocate for whatever might be best for Crockett. CIA has brought many County Supervisors to town, even monthly for many years, so that a continuing dialogue can take place for Crockett's benefit. CIA's greatest success in advocacy was in wringing concessions from Caltrans during recent Carquinez Bridge projects. CIA also built and maintains our downtown Plaza, with beautification projects being the second great emphasis of CIA volunteers.

CIA meets the first Tuesday of the month at 7:00 P.M. at the Community Center, and they welcome everyone. Visit their Facebook group page: *CrockettCIA*.

Did You Know?

What we call Crockett today began as three different townships. Early CROCKETT developed east of West Street, while the town of VALONA developed to the west of Third Avenue on property owned by John Muir and Dr. John Strentzel. The township of CROLONA was created by C&H on the land between Crockett and Valona. Today's Rolph Avenue was then Valley Street. Some say that Crolona was created as a barrier to prevent Crockett and Valona from merging into a single, more powerful town that might be less easily controlled by C&H. Times have since changed for the better!

Complaint Desk

Why are some local paths/sidewalks being closed in town? We need them to get around on foot! What can we do?

Crockett's once extensive network of "chicken walks" is greatly diminished today. Paths were incorporated into some of the earliest sub-divisions so that students could take shortcuts to school and adults could more easily get to stores on foot. Most were actually owned and maintained by C&H for their workers and families. When the County refused to accept ownership of the "chicken walks," C&H began to quit-claim them to adjacent property owners, if willing. Also, where thru-roads were never built in County rights-of-way, the County began to quietly abandon the land to adjacent owners. So for years we've seen fences and gates and notrespassing signs spring up without warning, to the disbelief of pedestrians who were suddenly locked out from familiar routes. The Crockett Improvement Assn. would have liked to keep them open and maintained but remains disappointed at these closures.
