AUTOMATED LICENSE LATE READERS (ALPR) SURVEY Deadline to Return the Survey is October 1st

ALPR software is a computer technology that uses cameras to automatically read license plates, and other identifying characteristics of a vehicle-the make, model, color and unique identifiers. These cameras capture the license numbers and transmit plate data to a database (National Crime Information Center, CA, DMV, Local BOLO's etc.) which runs a check for the vehicles possible involvement in:

- Amber Alerts Silver Alerts Abducted and missing persons Wanted persons Stolen vehicles
- Other crimes (i.e. drug trafficking, stolen property, illegal weapons, scene of a crime, etc.)

They are typically mounted on street poles, streetlights, highway overpasses, mobile trailers, or attached to law enforcement vehicles. The data, which includes photographs of the vehicles and sometimes the driver and passenger, is uploaded to a central server.

Crockett Police Liaison Committee is looking into ALPR to assist the sparse coverage we have from law enforcement, and to assist them with their **protection of our community**. The cameras are not just used by local law enforcement, but also by the Highway Patrol as well as other cities and towns...

In the first 8 months that the city of Benicia used their ALPR, they had 51 arrests:

- 14 were violent offenders (drive-by shooting, robberies, homicide, violent and sexual assaults). Of those only 18% were residents and 82% were non residents of Benicia.
- 17 guns were seized 13 cases involved taking drugs off the streets 25 stolen cars were recovered \$189,260 recovered in vehicles and property.

We are asking the community to let us know what you think about this idea. **THE PURCHASE OF ANY READERS WILL BE GRANT FUNDED**. The coverage provided will help local law enforcement, who do not have the officers to patrol as much as a larger town.
