The Crockett Community Services District (Crockett CSD) is your local government providing municipal services to Crockett and Port Costa. We are eager to foster informed civic engagement. We answer to you, the voters of Crockett and Port Costa, and we are working to become more visible and better understood through publications such as this. We are also working to upgrade our website with an emphasis on building a growing community of better informed users. We intend to expand our presence on social media platforms as well in an effort to foster conversation with our voters and other people and businesses that we serve.

Crockett CSD has an elected Board of five Directors who oversee the work of three Commissions and other Committees of dedicated volunteers. The next election to the Board of Directors will occur this November, at which time three seats will be open to civic-minded individuals for four year terms. Elections will be handled by the County Election Dept. Election papers may be obtained from the Election Dept. starting July 16 and must be filed by August 10. No experience is required, just a serious interest in being involved in civic functions.

The Crockett Sanitary Commission and the Port Costa Sanitary Commission oversee the provision of sewer services in Crockett and Port Costa through the hard work of our staff lead by General Manager Dale McDonald. James Barnhill is our manager for the Port Costa Sanitary Department, while Dale manages the Crockett Sanitary Department. Commissioners are appointed by the District Board of Crockett CSD after posting a notice of vacancy and interviewing applicants. Providing sewer service is actually quite challenging, and therefore costly. All wastewater from both communities must be rigorously cleaned and sanitized before discharge into the Carquinez Strait. Crockett and Port Costa have separate treatment plants, each with its own regulatory standards to be met without fail. Each community has its own sewer system, to be maintained and repaired sufficiently to prevent any sewer overflow or spill. Every spill that occurs is a serious violation that can draw unwanted attention and potential fines from the Regional Water Quality Control Board. Every spill is considered an EMERGENCY by state and regional authorities, so we need our residents to immediately report to (continued on page 4)

Featured Service Organization

In this issue we showcase the **CROCKETT LIONS CLUB**, a local non-profit that has been an important part of the community for a very long time. The Club is part of the International Lions, which has 1.4 million members in 206 countries. Lions participate in disaster relief, blind centers, and in collecting and distributing millions of donated eyeglasses free to third-world countries. Crockett Lions support the boy scouts, local churches and schools, and give scholarships. They also support a proposed dog park in Crockett and they loan wheelchairs and walkers to local residents. Regionally, the Crockett Lions support disabled kids, helping to build a special playground in Concord and participating in an annual outdoor party for about 1500 in the East Bay.

The Club has about 50 members ranging in age from 15 to 98. Older members are a rare source of history, telling personal stories about Crockett dating back to the 1930's. Our high school has a successful youth group called Leos who volunteer at town functions and help raise money for people in need.

The Crockett Lions meet over breakfast every Wednesday from 7:30 to 8:30 AM at Scout Hall, always with a guest speaker. They welcome new members whether you can attend the breakfast meetings or not. Lions hold three big fund-raisers annually: a corned beef dinner in February, a pasta feed in June, and a barbeque in September. They also provide a free holiday dinner for Crockett in December.

Can't something be done to stop the dumping along Cummings Skyway, Crockett Blvd. and other local roads?

This has been a subject of local anger and concern forever, but with no affordable remedies. The County seems to do what it can to remove vehicles and the largest piles of rubbish, but ours is a large county with a lot of dumpers. Crockett Improvement Association works at keeping Crockett Blvd. and the bridgehead and some other streets clean, and it gets monthly cooperation from the County Public Works Dept. in disposing of collected litter. Phillips66 has donated money to aid CIA's success, and support from C&H is now being sought. Beyond that, there is the usual talk about camera surveillance and warning signs to scare people away. But people don't scare and money is in short supply. Still, thanks to some of you for taking pictures of people who may be dumping. We know you care because volunteers who are removing litter are sometimes photographed in the act of doing good! They don't take offense, though. They're just happy that you care!

We depend on our residents to warn us immediately of any possible sewage spill or leak anywhere in Crockett or Port Costa.
